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Moonlighting

“Moonlighting” is the term applied to post-graduate medical trainees who work for income outside of their training program.

Policy:

For the purpose of section 12(2)(e) of the Regulated Health Professions Act, Post-Graduate Medical Trainees applicants applying for the purpose of Moonlighting must have:

- 1) Time in training program;
 - a) Successfully completed at least three years of training in the post-graduate medical training program, including any required examinations (for who are enrolled in a Specific Disciplines training program)
or
 - b) Not more than six months remaining of training in the post-graduate medical training program (for those who are enrolled in a Family Medicine training program)
- 2) A letter of recommendation from the administrator of their post-graduate medical training program indicating the applicant is in good standing and that Moonlighting will not interfere with their training program.
- 3) A letter of support from Health PEI indicating the name of the physician arranged to be the supervisor. Designated in accordance with section 33 to oversee the applicant’s practice of medicine.
